


Plato, Epistle XIII – a brief introduction

Plato (c. 427–c. 347 BCE) was an Athenian philosopher. The most influential of Socrates' followers, he composed at least twenty-five philosophical dialogues and founded the Academy c. 385. Thirteen letters of questionable authenticity were also attributed to him in antiquity. Four of these are addressed to Dionysius II of Syracuse (see bearded figure in image), four to Dion of Syracuse and his friends and the remainder to other contemporary rulers and statesmen.

Plato supposedly visited Syracuse for the first time in 388/387 when Dionysius I was tyrant. He is said to have admired the character and abilities of the ruler's brother-in-law Dion and the two established a strong friendship based on an enthusiasm for philosophy. When the young Dionysius II succeeded in 367, Dion persuaded Plato to return in order that they might make his ideal state ruled by a philosopher-king a reality. Neither Dionysius nor the Syracusans were too pleased with their initiatives, however, and Dion was soon forced into exile amid rumours of disloyalty. Plato returned to Syracuse once more in 360, this time at the invitation of Dionysius himself who now wished to present himself as a man of great learning. Plato accepted and again tried to mentor the tyrant. He also took the opportunity to persuade Dionysius to restore his uncle Dion. The relationship between teacher and pupil again broke down, this time with Dionysius becoming aggressive towards the philosopher. Plato was apparently confined to the palace and routinely disrespected while Dion was further deprived of his wife, child and property. The philosopher was eventually rescued



through the intervention of Archytas of Tarentum. Dion had his revenge in 357 when he seized control of Syracuse by arms. His attempts at reform were again met with hostility, however, and he was assassinated in 353. Dionysius resumed power in 346 but was again deposed and died a few years later.

If authentic, Epistle XIII to Dionysius belongs to the period after the philosopher's second visit to Syracuse (366–365). Below are the seven passages that we will be translating and discussing over the course of the week. Among the matters discussed are mathematics, dried figs, Plato's great-nieces and Dion. Vocabulary lists are provided at the end of each passage.
